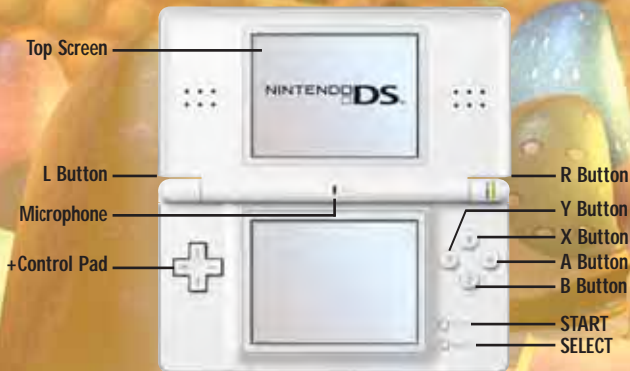

Bee Stats – While in the Hive, train with the Pollen Jocks to increase your Stamina, Strength and Speed to build up your Bee Stats. The higher your Bee Stats are, the more Barry is able to do while in New York City and New Hive City.

- *Speed* – Allows Barry to fly faster.
- *Stamina* – Allows Barry to fly to higher tiers. New Hive City has two tiers and New York City has three tiers that hold different missions and adventures for Barry. Also, an increase in Stamina increases Barry's total hit points.
- *Strength* – Allows Barry to lift heavier things and push larger items around.

In Story Mode, save the Hive's honey as you set out for adventure in the world outside the Hive... New York City!

The city is broken down into the following three locations:

Central Park – Be sure to avoid the rain as you help other insects in a variety of exciting adventures in the park.
